MR. CAMERON: Oscar, I want to make sure that you get a chance to finish what you're saying because it's very, very serious and I do want to go back to the question you posed and see if we can address that. Obviously, we can't address all of your specific comments, but I think that it's very important for you to talk with the staff after the meeting and I would just ask you to, if you have more to say along this line, when we get very shortly to the formal comment, to just come up and finish it up with us.

But let me put your question before the NRC staff. I think that you heard the generic point that Oscar was raising and perhaps someone from the NRC staff could talk to how in license renewal, I think the safety evaluation question, how those types of issues are looked at and whether, I think the point was that there's deficiencies apart from the aging issues and how are those issues looked at.

John, do you know where I'm trying to go with this in terms of trying to provide some information to the public? And I do think that we need to talk to Oscar about some of the specifics after the meeting because we can't go into those now.
